- Building a Supported, Resourced and Informed Workforce

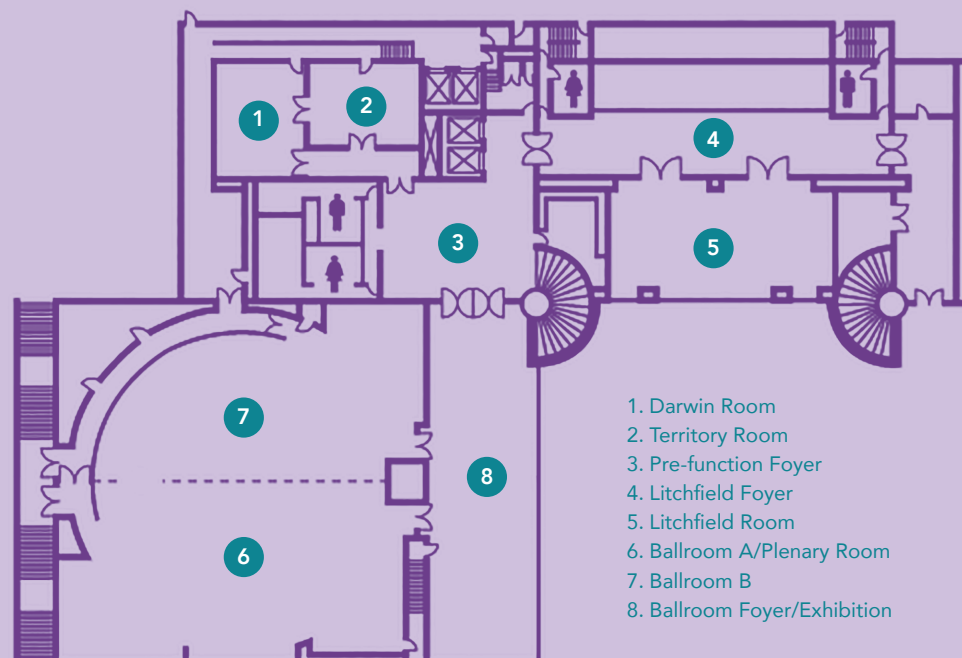
